From our Board Chair and CEO

There are over 60,000 foster children and youth in California, with a sizable portion of them in the regions where Walden operates: San Diego, Los Angeles, Riverside, and San Bernardino. The future isn't always bright for these young people, particularly for those of color or who are LGBTQIA+. Foster children may experience the destabilizing effects of multiple placements. At the same time, those with special needs may not receive sufficient medical and behavioral services, causing them to become homeless or incarcerated upon leaving the system.

Since 1976, Walden has been addressing the plight of foster children, youth, and families, helping them recover and thrive. Walden offers a Transitional Housing Placement Program (THP) for youth 18-26 aging out of the system, a Foster Care and Adoption Program, a Mental Health Program, and Nurturing Families, a parenting training program.

Last year, Walden provided services to 1,751 children, youth, and families. While Walden served a record population, the quality of care remained high. Outcomes for clients were overwhelmingly positive: children experienced the security of remaining in one foster home, and those with special needs were stabilized; youth were employed or pursuing higher learning and exited the THP Program to stable housing. Parents who lost custody of their kids were trained to raise their children responsibly and lovingly, saving taxpayer funds by reuniting from foster care quickly.

Housing for transitional-age youth in our THP Program remains a top priority. With assistance from the public-funded Project Homekey, Walden now owns and manages properties in Riverside, housing 30 youth. Walden seeks funding to purchase additional real estate in Southern California. The need is pressing: 50% of foster youth become homeless within two years of aging out of care without the support of programs like THP. Walden is meeting this tragic situation head-on, offering housing to keep transitional-age youth from living in cars and on sidewalks.

With California facing a multi-billion-dollar deficit, cuts to foster care and programs for foster youth were inevitable. The state has already reduced foster care rates after a devastating cut in 2010, which has not been reinstated. Walden is aggressively fundraising to bridge the gap between revenue and expenses and will continue to do so. Walden has remained financially stable for 48 years, and we will continue to offer our life-changing programs, no matter the financial challenges.

Walden continues to advocate for the neediest children, youth, and families, supporting and co-creating policies that work for foster youth.

Thank you for advocating for Walden and joining us as we strive to bring hope and genuine humanitarian progress to our deserving young people. Together, we can help turn their dreams for promising futures into reality.

Our Programs



Transitional Housing Programs& Youth Services

Walden Family Services offers crucial support through its Transitional Housing Placement Program (THP) for foster and former foster youth. The program provides a safety net for transition-age youth, allowing them to receive the support they need to successfully transition to adulthood and avoid the homelessness, poverty, and unemployment so many of them face.

The THP program allows youth to extend their stay in foster care from ages 18-21. The THP Plus Program serves former foster youth up to age 25, providing the same services but with lessened oversight.

The THP Programs offer free housing, weekly visits with a Social Worker, Education Support (help acquiring a GED and pursuing higher learning), Employment Support (help preparing for and securing employment), Life Skills Training (budgeting, household management, healthy lifestyle), a money management program, access to medical and mental healthcare), and more. Youth are prepared to house and support themselves long-term and to thrive.

Foster Family Agency (FFA)

Safe and Secure Family Placement Program - Children in need are placed in the temporary care of foster/resource families who provide a nurturing and supportive environment. In these homes, children experience a sense of safety, respect, and belonging, which is crucial for their well-being. Children receive the stability and support needed to live with confidence and well-being.

Adoption Services - As a licensed adoption agency, Walden is devoted to connecting children and youth in foster care with loving families across Southern California. We guide families through the adoption process, ensuring that each child finds a permanent and supportive home. Our focus is on making the journey as smooth as possible, helping to create lasting, loving connections.

Parent Training - Walden's Parent Resource & Education Program (PREP) empowers foster and adoptive parents with the knowledge and skills necessary to provide exceptional care. This competency-based training is a corner- stone of our foster family agency and adoption services, ensuring that families are fully equipped to support and nurture the children in their care.



Our Programs



Family Services

Walden Family Services offers a Nurturing Families Program to parents who have lost or are in danger of losing custody of their children. The curriculum emphasizes empathetic and loving parenting. Parents learn skills that help them meet their children's needs and responsibly raise them. In addition to training, Walden's team connects parents with essential community resources to further assist them on their journey.

Many participants in the Nurturing Families Program were in the foster system themselves and have not have had positive role models for parenting. By teaching parents how to nurture and meet the needs of their children, the program plays a vital role in breaking the cycle of trauma often seen in the child welfare system.

"Through the Nurturing Families Program, I discovered the joy and importance of reading with my child. Growing up, this wasn't something I experienced, but now, reading to Sonyia has become a cherished time for us," shared Maria, a proud graduate of the program.

YOUTH IN ACTION: AMAYA'S FUNDRAISING JOURNEY





We're consistently moved by the dedication and compassion of our supporters, especially when it comes from the next generation. This year, we were particularly inspired by the efforts of Amaya, a soon-to-be 8th grader at American Martyrs School in Manhattan Beach.

Amaya's journey began with a challenge from her Pastor at the end of her 7th-grade year. Each rising 8th grader at her school receives a small amount of seed money, a symbolic gesture meant to encourage students to grow and multiply their 'talents' for a charitable cause. While many might see this as just another school project, Amaya saw an opportunity to make a meaningful impact.

Choosing Walden Family Services as her cause, Amaya decided to spend her summer break raising funds by selling sourdough starter and sourdough pizza dough. With determination and a lot of hard work, she not only met the challenge but exceeded all expectations, raising over \$500 to support our mission!

Amaya's initiative is more than just a fundraising success—it's a powerful reminder of the impact that even one person, regardless of age, can have on the lives of others. Her dedication to helping youth in foster care reflects the very spirit of community and compassion that we strive to foster at Walden.

Walden Family Services' Uses Homekey Funds to Open TAY Housing in Riverside

In 2024, Walden Family Services took a significant step forward in their mission to support transitional-aged youth by acquiring two new transitional housing properties in Riverside, California. These acquisitions were made possible through the public-funded Homekey grant, which was awarded to Walden Family Services as part of California's ongoing efforts to combat homelessness and provide stable hous-

ing for vulnerable populations.

The first property, a beautifully remodeled home, offers six bedrooms, four baths, and 1,627 square feet of living space, including dedicated housing for mothers and their children. The second, larger property boasts seven bedrooms and four

baths, with over 4,000 square feet of living space. Both homes were specifically designed to provide a nurturing environment where foster youth, aged 18-21, could receive the support and guidance they need as they transitioned into adulthood.

These new properties are a vital addition to Walden's THP Program, empowering young adults and guiding them towards permanent housing.

Teresa Stivers, CEO of Walden Family Services, expressed her pride in the expansion, stating, "In 2024, we strengthened our commitment to the Riverside community and the young individuals we serve. We're thrilled that we can help bring a sense of normalcy to the lives of local foster youth." These new transitional housing properties have enabled us to offer a supportive

environment where our clients can develop essential life skills, access education and job opportunities,

> and ultimately achieve selfsufficiency as they transition into adulthood."

As the sole recipient of the Homekey Project funds in Riverside, Walden Family Services maximized the grant by ensuring that the homes were equipped to meet the needs of their residents. The properties featured Single Room Occupancy (SRO) and adults to

units, allowing multiple young adults to share housing while still maintaining their own personal space. This setup not only provided affordable housing but also fostered a sense of community among the residents.

With the addition of these new transitional housing properties, Walden continued to expand its reach in the Inland Empire, ensuring that more young individuals in need received the support they deserved.

Looking ahead, Walden Family
Services plans to continue
acquiring additional housing
units throughout Southern
California. The goal remains clear:
to provide vulnerable youth with the

resources and support they need to live as independent and productive members of the community. The expansion in Riverside is a testament to the ongoing dedication to Walden's mission and a promise of the positive impact Walden will continue to make in the lives of transitional-aged youth for years to come.




