From our Board Chair and Chief Executive Officer

There are more than 60,000 foster children and youth in California, with a sizable portion of them in the regions where Walden operates: San Diego, Los Angeles, Riverside, and San Bernardino. The future isn't always bright for these young people. Foster children may experience the destabilizing effects of multiple placements. At the same time, those with special needs may not receive sufficient medical and behavioral services, causing them to become homeless or incarcerated upon leaving the system.

Since 1976, Walden has been addressing the plight of foster children, youth, and families, helping them recover and thrive. Walden offers a Transitional Housing Placement Program (THP) for youth 18-26 aging out of the system, a Foster Care and Adoption Program, Nurturing Families, and a parenting training program.

Last year, Walden provided services to 1,498 children, youth, and families. While Walden served a record population, the quality of care remained high. Outcomes for clients were overwhelmingly positive: children experienced the security of remaining in one foster home, and those with special needs were stabilized; youth were employed or pursuing higher learning and exited the THP Program to stable housing. We provided training around how to raise children responsibly and lovingly to parents who had lost custody of their kids. Through the creation of pathways for reunification, Walden's programs generated significant savings for taxpayers.

Housing for transitional-age youth in our THP Program remains a top priority. With assistance from the public-funded Project Homekey, Walden now owns and manages properties in Riverside, housing 30 youth. Walden seeks funding to purchase additional real estate in Southern California. The need is pressing: 50% of foster youth become homeless within two years of aging out of care without the support of programs like THP. Walden is meeting this tragic situation head-on, offering housing to keep transitional-age youth from living in cars and on sidewalks.

With California facing a multi-billion-dollar budget deficit, cuts to foster care and programs for foster youth were inevitable. The state has already reduced foster care rates after a devastating cut in 2010, which has not been reinstated. And, as insurance rates for foster family agencies skyrocket, many organizations find themselves at risk of shutting their doors, potentially displacing countless children from their homes. Walden is aggressively fundraising to bridge the gap between revenue and expenses. Walden has remained financially stable for 49 years, and we will continue to offer our life-changing programs, despite the financial challenges.

Walden will always advocate for the neediest children, youth, and families, supporting and co-creating policies that work for foster youth.

Thank you for advocating for Walden and joining us as we strive to bring hope and genuine humanitarian progress to our deserving young people. **Together, we can help turn their dreams for promising futures into reality.**

Our Programs

Transitional Housing Programs & Youth Services



Walden Family Services offers crucial support through its **Transitional Housing Placement Program (THP)** for foster and former foster youth.

The program provides a safety net for transition-age youth, allowing folks to receive the support they need to successfully transition to adulthood and avoid the homelessness, poverty, and unemployment so many of them face.

The THP program allows youth to extend their stay in foster care from ages 18 to 21. The THP Plus Program serves former foster youth up to age 26, providing the same services but with decreased oversight.

The THP Programs offer free housing, weekly visits with a Social Worker, Education Support (help acquiring a GED and pursuing higher learning), Employment Support (help preparing for and securing employment), Life Skills Training (budgeting, household management, healthy lifestyle), a money management program, access to medical and mental healthcare), and more. Youth are prepared to house and support themselves long-term and to thrive.

Foster Family Agency (FFA)

Safe and Secure Family Placement Program: When children need temporary care, Walden connects them with foster and resource families who provide the love, stability, and support every child deserves. In these homes, children find safety, respect, and a sense of belonging that helps them begin to heal and thrive.

Adoption Services: As a licensed adoption agency, Walden is committed to creating forever families for children and youth in foster care. We walk alongside families throughout the adoption journey, making the process clear and supportive while focusing on what matters most: helping every child find a permanent, loving home.

Parent Training: Through our Parent Resource & Education Program (PREP), Walden equips foster and adoptive parents with the tools, skills, and confidence to provide exceptional care. This hands-on training ensures families are prepared to nurture, guide, and empower the children who enter their homes.



Our Programs

Family Services

Walden Family Services' Nurturing Families Program is designed to support parents who have lost, or are at risk of losing, custody of their children. The program centers on empathetic, compassionate parenting, helping parents learn the skills needed to meet their children's needs and raise them in safe, stable, and loving homes. Alongside hands-on training, Walden connects families with vital community resources, ensuring



Many of the parents who join Nurturing Families are former foster youth themselves, often without positive parenting role models. By teaching them how to nurture and guide their own children, the program helps break cycles of trauma and creates opportunities for stronger, healthier family bonds.

Ray's Journey of Resilience, Hope, and The Power of Family

At just two months old, Ray was placed with the Phelan Family through Walden Family Services. Born exposed to multiple substances, testing positive for syphilis and other illnesses, and suffering a stroke while still in the hospital, Ray spent his earliest days filled with uncertainty. His birth mother faced homelessness, health challenges, and had no prenatal care, leaving Ray with an uphill battle from the very beginning.

But everything began to change once he entered a Walden foster home. With the love and stability of the Phelan Family, along with support from Walden social workers, Ray began receiving occupational therapy, speech therapy, and other vital services at just 18 months old. While his developmental milestones came later than most, each one was celebrated with joy and encouragement by those who surrounded him.

When it became clear that reunification with Ray's birth family would not be possible, the Phelan Family made it official by adopting him. Their commitment to him has been unwavering—nurturing his growth, advocating for his specialized education, and giving him the security of a forever home.





Walden's adoption team continued to walk alongside them, helping ensure Ray received the best opportunities to thrive.

Over the years, Ray has blossomed with the encouragement and dedication of his family. The Phelans never let his early challenges define him, instead focusing on his strengths, his laughter, and his bright spirit. Their home has been filled with therapy sessions, school meetings, and countless small victories, all of

> which they've embraced with patience and love. Ray has grown into a curious, energetic child who loves being outdoors and exploring the world around him.

Today, Ray is in first grade in a special education classroom. After the Phelan Family retired from fostering and relocated to the Midwest, Ray now enjoys chasing fireflies, playing with cousins, and spending time with his grandpar-

ents, aunts, and uncles. He also maintains a special connection to his birth great-grandmother, who remains part of his extended family and keeps him connected to his roots.

The Phelan Family has also opened their hearts to two more children adopted through Walden, extending their circle of love and care. Their story is a beautiful reminder that foster care and adoption can transform lives—not just for children like Ray, but for the families who embrace them.


The Walden Difference


